is the author of three books on the implications of Henry Corbin's work for contemporary spirituality: The World Turned Inside Out, Green Man—Earth Angel and After Prophecy. He was Associate Professor and Director of Environmental Studies at Wilson College in Pennsylvania and is Adjunct Professor at the College of the Atlantic in Bar Harbor, Maine and has taught at Pacifica Graduate Institute in Carpenteria, CA.

Henry Corbin (1903-1978) is most widely known as one of the 20th century's most important and prolific scholars of Islamic mysticism. But he was also an ecumenical theologian and philosopher whose cross-cultural perspective is of profound significance for the contemporary world. He introduced the concept of the *mundus imaginalis* into contemporary thought and his work has had a lasting impact on scholars of religion, depth psychologists, visionary thinkers and poets. But Corbin's central project was to provide a spiritual and intellectual framework for understanding the unity of the religions of the monotheistic tradition. His life was devoted to the struggle to free the religious imagination from fundamentalisms of every kind. His uniquely ecumenical approach makes his work essential reading in a complex and pluralistic age.
